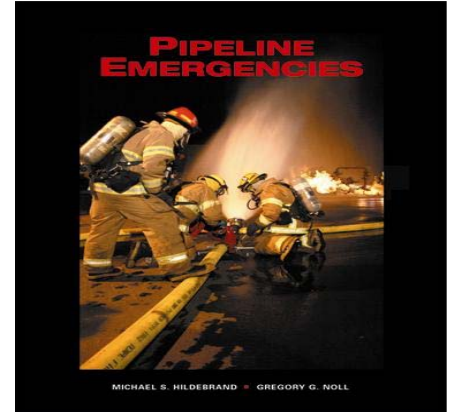


PIPELINE EMERGENCIES

He is the lead instructor on the video training series by Emergency Resources Inc. - "Surviving the Hazardous Materials Incident". He was a member of the Propane Emergencies Training project sponsored by the propane Education Research Council. This program and textbook was delivered to every

fire department in the United States in 1999. He is director of his own business - Callan and Company. Mr. Callan conducts Safety Seminars and Chemical Response training around the country for Industrial and Municipal Haz-Mat Teams. He has keynoted the FDIC in Indianapolis, Cincinnati, and numerous conferences and seminars around the United States, Canada and in Europe and South East Asia.
